

Top 10 Highly Rated Coworking & Office Spaces in Montreal

Montréal's coworking scene offers an array of innovative, community-driven workspaces. From historic bank halls converted into bustling cowork hubs to modern lofts with rooftop amenities, the city caters to freelancers, startups, and growing teams alike. Below we explore ten of the top-rated office and coworking spaces in Montreal – starting with the much-loved **2727 Coworking** – highlighting their user reviews, amenities, unique features, target clientele, pricing transparency, and location perks.



2727 Coworking

Overview: Nestled at the edge of the Lachine Canal in Griffintown (near Atwater Market), 2727 Coworking delivers a modern, high-tech workspace with a low-stress vibe (Source: coworker.com). It's a boutique space service provider geared toward small teams and entrepreneurs seeking collaboration and "sharing in innovation, synergy and technology" (Source: coworker.com). Members enjoy 24/7 access to sleek offices and open desks designed for productivity. Crew Collective & Café

Overview: Housed in the former Royal Bank headquarters at 360 St-Jacques, Crew Collective & Café is both a stunning café **and** a coworking space. Its 15-metre gilded ceilings, marble floors, and ornate chandeliers inspire awe – no wonder *Forbes* voted Crew **"the most beautiful coworking space in the world"* (Source: <u>blog.mtl.org</u>). This unique venue is open to the public as a café in the main hall, while also offering dedicated work areas, meeting rooms, and private offices for members. With a **4.5** ★ **Google rating** from over 2,600 reviews (Source: <u>coworkingspaces.me</u>), Crew is hugely popular. Visitors



love the ambiance – as one Yelp review notes, "coming here is just for the vibe of the place" – and remote workers appreciate the blend of café bustle and productive work zones. Short-term needs are welcome (you can simply grab a coffee and work at a table), and there are also membership plans for full-time access to the upstairs coworking floors.

Amenities & Features: Crew Collective uniquely combines coffee shop convenience with office amenities. In the public area, you can order gourmet coffee, pastries, and lunch either at the counter or via an app to be delivered to your table (Source: blog.mtl.org) – fuel to keep you going. In the members-only sections, there's an open coworking lounge and bookable glass-enclosed meeting rooms amid the bank's grand architecture. Teams of 6–18 can even rent private suites on a mezzanine level for short or long terms (Source: blog.mtl.org). Despite the historic shell, all modern comforts are present: fast Wi-Fi, plenty of outlets, phone booths, and ergonomic chairs at workstations. Community events and networking mixers are occasionally held, though the vibe is more "café" during the day. Target clientele: This space is perfect for freelancers and professionals who crave an inspiring atmosphere. Its central Old Montréal location is steps from Square-Victoria OACI station and offers an impressive setting to meet clients. Maison Notman House

Overview: Maison Notman House is a legendary hub in Montreal's startup ecosystem. Housed in a 19th-century stone mansion on Sherbrooke Street, Notman House operates as a technology coworking hub and incubator. It provides a communal open office, plus 22 private office spaces for its members (Source: thefarmsoho.com). Startups, tech entrepreneurs, and nonprofit tech organizations gravitate here for the history and the built-in community. The building includes an event space for tech meetups and demos, and it famously hosts incubator programs (it was home to FounderFuel accelerator). The atmosphere is organic and characterful – think hardwood floors, fireplaces, and a mix of historic charm and startup energy. The campus also features a beautiful outdoor Zen Garden in the courtyard, offering a peaceful spot to work or chat under the trees (Source: surfoffice.com). Notman House is highly regarded (rated 4.5★ on Yelp and earning a 9.7/10 score from Surf Office (Source: surfoffice.com)) for fostering collaboration. Amenities & Features: Despite the vintage architecture, Notman is fully equipped for modern work. Montréal Cowork (Plateau Mont-Royal)

Overview: Montréal Cowork is a bright, modern coworking space located in the Plateau (4388 St-Denis Street). It has earned a 4.7 ★ rating on Google with users praising its cleanliness and friendly atmosphere (Source: coworkingspaces.me). The space caters to a broad community, from solo freelancers to teams up to 10, with workstations ranging from communal desks to private rooms. Halte 24-7

It maintains a 4.7 ★ rating (with 80+ reviews) thanks to its reliable facilities and helpful staff (Source: coworkingspaces.me). WeWork (Place Ville Marie)

Anticafé (Downtown/Plateau)

Overview: Anticafé Montréal flips the typical café model on its head: here you pay for time, not coffee. For a nominal hourly rate, Anticafé provides a cozy café-like space where unlimited coffee, tea, and biscuits are included (Source: blog.mtl.org). This concept has made Anticafé a beloved spot for students, freelancers and anyone who needs a few hours of workspace without committing to a monthly rent. The main Anticafé is located at 294 Ste-Catherine Ouest (near Place des Arts), boasting about 4,000 sq. ft. of eclectic, artsy space (Source: blog.mtl.org). With a 4.8 ** average rating from over 200 Google reviews (Source: coworkingspaces.me), it's clear that users adore the experience. One guest described it as "the perfect place for students. If you need to spend more than 4 hours doing work and you can't stand the thought of going to a library, this is the place for you. Snacks and coffee are provided



unlimited... It feels almost like a community while you're there." (Source: coworkingspaces.me). The atmosphere is often compared to a living room or a friendly student lounge – vintage furniture, colorful decor, and a laid-back vibe that sparks creativity.

Amenities & Features: At Anticafé, your hourly fee (around \$3-4/hour) grants access to all the selfserve coffee, an assortment of teas, cookies, fruits, and sometimes even homemade banana bread you want. You can literally grab a mug and help yourself in the kitchen area. The space itself is divided into various zones: there are 45 individual workstations and 12 private rooms/meeting rooms spread across the venue (Source: blog.mtl.org). Need a quiet corner? Settle into a beanbag or a seat by the window. Need to discuss with a group or hold a tutoring session? Book (at no extra cost) one of the small private rooms. The entire café has Wi-Fi, of course, and you'll find board games and books on the shelves for when you want to unwind. They even host workshops and activities, like a popular weekly life drawing class that anyone can join for a token fee (Source: blog.mtl.org) - blending art and work to keep the creative juices flowing. Importantly, Anticafé's pricing is capped daily (around \$16/day maximum) - so if you end up staying all day, you won't be charged more than the day cap. They also offer a very affordable monthly membership for regulars. Target clientele: Anticafé is perfect for students, writers, digital nomads on a budget, or startup teams who occasionally need a casual meeting spot. It's more casual than a traditional coworking space - you won't get a dedicated desk or mailing address here - but it's an amazing third space between home and office. Located in the Quartier des Spectacles, it's super accessible (Place-des-Arts metro) and surrounded by downtown buzz. For those who value community and comfort (and lots of free snacks!) over corporate polish, Anticafé hits the sweet spot.

Fabrik8 (Mile-Ex)

Overview: Fabrik8 is a next-generation workspace that combines coworking with a full-service business center and a focus on wellness. Located in the burgeoning Mile-Ex district (near Little Italy/Parc-Ex), Fabrik8's Waverly Street campus is a 120,000 sq ft modern complex (opened 2020) offering shared workspaces alongside private offices and even labs. It's designed for startups and established companies that want more than just desks – here you get an entire lifestyle campus. Fabrik8 is known for its bright, open layouts and chic industrial design that encourages collaboration (Source: blog.mtl.org). The space has various rooms for small or large groups, including plenty of enclosed conference rooms for privacy (Source: blog.mtl.org). Members describe the atmosphere as warm and the community as tight-knit (Source: coworker.com). While Google ratings are a bit scarce for this newer location, word-of-mouth in the tech community is strong. It was popular enough to expand: Fabrik8 has two buildings in Mile-Ex and is expanding further. Amenities & Unique Perks: Fabrik8 truly stands out for its wellness and leisure amenities integrated into work life. Most famously, it features a rooftop outdoor hockey rink on the building's roof - yes, a real ice skating rink 7 floors up, which hosts tenant hockey games and free-skate sessions (Source: costar.com). This "ultimate Canadian office novelty" got press coverage and is frequently booked with an internal league (Source: costar.com) (Source: costar.com). Inside, Fabrik8 offers a fitness center/gym and organizes group workout classes for tenants. There's also a small indoor soccer area and other exercise options (Source: costar.com). For downtime, members can enjoy game areas like ping-pong tables and foosball (Source: blog.mtl.org). On the work side, everything is top-notch: ergonomic chairs, heightadjustable desks, blazing fast internet, and beautifully furnished lounges. There are phone booths, plenty of meeting rooms, and a large event space that can host workshops or socials. A gourmet on-site restaurant/cafeteria means you don't have to leave for lunch, and excellent coffee is on tap. Fabrik8 essentially offers an all-in-one environment where you can "work, play, and even exercise" without leaving the building. Target clientele: Given its scale and offerings, Fabrik8 appeals to growing startups and mid-size companies that want a fun, amenity-rich HQ without managing their own office lease. Freelancers and small teams are welcome too (they offer coworking memberships and smaller offices), though it's less of a drop-in space and more of a committed membership. Pricing for a hot desk or basic membership is higher-end (reflective of the premium facilities), with dedicated offices starting around \$1,465/month (Source: bestimmtl.com). For companies, the investment pays off in employee happiness -"Our aim is to get clients to want to come to the office... and this is having an impact," said Fabrik8's director about the lure of the amenities (Source: costar.com). If you're seeking an innovative work environment in a trendy neighborhood (Mile-Ex is now branded as an Al and tech hub), Fabrik8 is a top contender.

Temps Libre (Free Time) Mile End

Overview: Temps Libre Mile End (also known as "Free Time Mile End") is a community-centered coworking space run as a cooperative. Tucked in a converted industrial building on de Gaspé Avenue, Temps Libre is the heart of Mile End's entrepreneurial and creative community. It carries a 4.6 ★ rating with users frequently mentioning the great vibe and community spirit (Source: coworkingspaces.me). The space is airy and filled with natural light – one member described it as a "beautiful space, good work environment... lots of cool folks to interact with and [a] sense of community" (Source: coworkingspaces.me). Another perk they mentioned: "great location with nature views in the heart of the Mile End" (Source: coworkingspaces.me) – indeed, from the windows you can see the iconic view of Mount Royal and the greens of Mile End (some floors even overlook a park). Amenities & Features: The facility offers everything you'd need for a productive day: open coworking areas with communal tables, some quieter sections with individual desks, and phone booths for private calls. There are also a couple of conference rooms you can book for meetings. Members get 24/7 access with a keycard, allowing night or weekend work (Source: surfoffice.com). The community kitchen provides free coffee and tea, and you can often find snacks on the counter. Unique to Temps Libre, dogs are welcome - it's a dog-friendly office, so don't be surprised to see a pup or two lounging about (Source: surfoffice.com). This adds to the homey atmosphere. The membership plans are very affordable (as a cooperative, their goal is accessibility): they offer day passes, 10-day punch cards, and monthly memberships that undercut most commercial coworking rates. Despite the lower price, amenities aren't lacking: you still have high-speed internet, printing services, and even occasionally free workshops for members. Target clientele: Temps Libre attracts a lot of freelancers, nonprofit workers, writers, and small startup teams who prefer a grassroots feel to a corporate one. It's also a hit with the artsy Mile End crowd (designers, illustrators, etc.), and digital nomads who find it via word-of-mouth. Given the cooperative model, members often have a say in how the space is run and can propose events - which bolsters the sense of ownership and community. Location-wise, it's excellent: in the Mile End hub at 5605 de Gaspé, it's close to cafes, breweries, galleries, and the famous St-Viateur bagel shops for a quick break. If you're looking for a friendly, neighborhood-centric workplace with transparent pricing and a community vibe, Temps Libre is ideal. As one review put it, "highly recommend it as a coworking or event space!" (Source: coworkingspaces.me).

Nomad Life

Overview: Rounding out the list is **Nomad Life**, a truly multifaceted workspace in Mile End that merges coworking with creative studios. Nomad Life markets itself as a place to "meet, eat, work, play, meditate, collaborate and grow" (Source: thefarmsoho.com) – and it delivers on all fronts. This 24/7 facility on Avenue Van Horne provides not just open desks and offices, but also production studios for photography, video, podcasting, and events. It's a hybrid of a coworking space and a creative lab, making it one of the most unique offerings in Montreal. Nomad Life has an "electric" community of like-minded professionals in media, arts, and tech (Source: surfoffice.com). While relatively new, it has gained popularity for its innovative concept (Surf Office rated it among the top spaces in the city). Members love the freedom and versatility – you can edit a video in the studio in the morning, take a client call in a phone booth at noon, attend a meditation class in the afternoon, and then grab a beer at their in-house café-bar during a vernissage event in the evening. All under one roof!

Amenities & Features: Nomad Life is loaded with facilities tailored to creators. To start, there are openplan coworking areas and dedicated desks with all the usual fixings (good Wi-Fi, comfy chairs, meeting rooms, printing). But what sets it apart are the specialty spaces: a **photography studio** with backdrops and lighting equipment, a **recording studio** for audio (podcasts, music), and even a small auditorium



space for screenings or events (Source: surfoffice.com) (Source: thefarmsoho.com). Members can book these facilities as needed, often at a discounted rate or included in higher-tier plans.
